## **From the Stewardship Committee:**

Many of us link stewardship solely to fall programs focused on increasing the pledge. That certainly was my view of stewardship in past years, but I've come to understand it really has a broader meaning. We've all heard that stewardship was time, talent and treasure, but the focus was always on money and that needs to change as we go forward at St. Anne's. Don't get me wrong, money is important but Stewardship is more than that.

First of all, we need to take the time to recognize at a personal level just how much that has been done over the years really is stewardship: the time many people have contributed to successful Christmas Fairs, the Strawberry Festival, golf tournaments and the thrift shop; the talents of those who have worked to manage and coordinate activities, fix things, teach Sunday school and keep computers running; and of course, those who contribute to our financial health not only with pledges but when additional funds were needed for such things as Thrift Shop repairs and an AED unit.

We also need to look at stewardship at a higher level: What does St. Anne's as a parish contribute to the community? Certainly the biggest part of that contribution today is the Thrift Shop which provides clothing and other household items to people in need. In past years, we've also provided Christmas gifts for children of prisoners at the House of Correction and keeping in mind our own limitations, maybe there are other things we should be doing as a parish.

Stewardship really is what we do with what we've got – at a personal level what we can do for the church and at a higher level, what the Church can do for the community. So as Fall approaches you'll hear more about pledges, but remember that those pledges are necessary so that we can continue with all of the other stewardship that's going on every day.
