## **From the Co-Warden:**

Did you ever Wonder....?

No, I'm not the next Andy Rooney, (if you don't know who Andy Rooney was, I guess my age is showing!!) but the question fits:

Did you ever wonder:

- Why St. Anne's decided to raise money for an AED?
- How the annual budget is formulated?
- How much we give in scholarship money each year?
- What Rev. Lauren does when it's not Sunday morning?

In general, have you ever wondered how the business of St. Anne's is done? All these questions and more are answered during vestry meetings. The vestry, as many of you know, is a committee made up of lay people from the parish who decide how St. Anne's is run from the business side. We are in very good hands from a spiritual and liturgical perspective with Rev. Lauren. I encourage you to attend a meeting, just listen or ask questions. They are currently held on the third Monday evening of the month and are announced at services prior to the meeting. Meetings generally last around 90 minutes and all meetings are open to the congregation.

Even better than attending a meeting is to consider running for a seat on the vestry. That's right; I suggested that you "run" for a seat. The Episcopal Church is a very democratic organization. Everything that we do from a business or administrative perspective is voted on by the members of the church. From the annual budget to how best to mitigate the smell of a skunk. These have been topics of discussion at vestry meetings. At the end of 2016 we will have four seats that need to be filled. These elections are held at our annual meeting in January.

Now, I know many of you reading this are saying one of two things. Either "I wouldn't know what to do or what to say at a meeting" or "been there, done that". Am I right? For the members who have "been there, done that", your experience and insight could be invaluable. For newer members, a fresh perspective can be refreshing. All you need is an open mind. If you're interested, attend a meeting or two before January and find out for yourself how the business of St. Anne's is done. Speak with Rev. Lauren, Mark or myself with any questions you may have. We can explain the process in more detail.

In the last newsletter, I ended by talking about beginning the next chapter of St. Anne's. This is a great way to help write that chapter.
