### From the Wardens

On the facilities side, many of you know that a tree came down on the roof of the administration building in a windstorm. Fortunately, there was no structural or rain damage but only two holes in the roof and a lot of damaged shingles. The tree has been removed and there is currently a tarp covering the damage to prevent rain from getting in. The Church Insurance Company will cover the damage and has approved a work proposal from Integrity Solutions to repair the roof. Work should begin in the next week or so. Also, piece of the fence behind our building came down and we still need to get that taken care of.

In case you've noticed, driveway barriers blocking have been put out to limit access to the Thrift Shop. This is a temporary measure to prevent people from dropping off items until the Thrift Shop can re-open.

I know there is talk about things opening sooner rather than later in some states and cities, but our policy is to follow Diocesan guidelines as things change. Several people at St. Anne's are on the Diocesan mailing list and we will keep everyone informed of any changes going forward.
