






Patient Turtle Craft




Materials

- 2 small paper plates (saucer size)
- · the patterns and rhyme on this page
- scissors
- · crayons, markers, or paints and paintbrushes
- glue



Directions

- Color the back of each paper plate green or brown and draw lines on them to make them look like the top and bottom of a turtle shell. (The turtle's top shell should be darker; the bottom one lighter.
- 2. Color and cut out the turtle head, feet, and tail on this page.
- 3. Glue the tabs of the head, feet, and tail to the uncolored side of one of the paper plates.
- 4. Glue the two plates together around the edges with the colored sides out.
- 5. Cut out the rhyme and glue it to the turtle's back.
- 6. Read the rhyme. Talk about some times when you get finished quickly and need to wait patiently for others.


- When you find a caterpillar, do you step on it? What should you do instead?


- Write on three of the footsteps some ways you can respect the earth by "walking" or living with gentleness.

- Read Romans 13:10. God would like all of us to be "harmless," not hurting others but helping.


