

Dear Student,

This month, we will be learning about Moses. There is a lot to the life of Moses. We will be focusing on just parts of his life. We will be looking at when God asked him to lead His people out of Egypt and when God gave him the Ten Commandments.

In your bible that you received last month, please turn to the second book. It is called Exodus. Exodus means "A mass departure of people." This book takes place many years after Abraham. There was a famine in the land that God had given Abraham, so all of Abraham's descendants (now called Israelites) moved to Egypt. The Pharaoh of Egypt made all the Israelites slaves.

Please read Chapter 3 of the book of Exodus. God got Moses' attention with a burning bush. How have you gotten someone's attention?

Why do you think Moses needed to be barefoot on holy ground? What does it mean to be holy?

As you get older, you tend to get more jobs. God gave Moses a job and he didn't feel up to the task. Have you ever been given a hard job? How did you handle it? How do you feel being given an important task? Did anyone help you?

I wonder how you feel hearing God say His name? Why are names important?

Skipping ahead to Chapter 19, please read verses 1-9 and Chapter 20, verses 1-21. God gives Moses a list of rules for the people to follow. We call them the 10 Commandments. The first four commandments have to do with loving God, the last six have to do with loving others. In what ways do they all show love?

Why are rules important? Are the rules that God gave unreasonable? Can you imagine a world without rules? What would that be like? Would you be able to trust your neighbor?


Have you ever broken a rule? What happens when rules are broken?

Exodus 20:3

1. Thou shalt not have no other gods before me.

2. Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image.

3. Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain.

4. Remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy.

5. Honor your father and your mother.

6. Thou shalt not kill.

7. Thou shalt not commit adultery.

8. Thou shalt not steal.

9. Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor.

10. Thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's house, thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's wife, nor his manservant, nor his maidservant, nor his ox, nor his ass, nor any thing that is thy neighbor's.
