

We are able and want to help you if you are having trouble with the technology. Please don't be embarrassed if you are having difficulty. This whole situation is difficult for all of us, but together, we'll get through it.

Greetings St. Anne's Family,

We are coming to the beginning of another year in the life of St. Anne's. It would be such an understatement to say that 2020 was just another year. It is a time for reflection of the past and wishful dreaming of the future.

God has welcomed some of our family home this past year and has also wrapped His healing arms around others. He has watched over all of us and has provided guidance and strength for St. Anne's to continue to not only survive, but to grow as a loving, supportive family. We have been blessed with the calling of The Rev. Jennifer Beal as our Priest-In-Charge. Mother Jennifer has instilled a peaceful, calming and loving atmosphere to support not only St. Anne's, but also our witness to Billerica and the surrounding communities.

Our worship service has changed in many ways, but is still centered on providing a safe time and place to peacefully listen for what the Prophet Elijah referred to as that "Still, Small Voice of God" speaking to us. The avenues of worship participation have increased depending on the comfort level of individual parishioners. Each member must carefully identify their own restrictions that will limit their participation. We have resumed limited in-person services but have also been blessed with the ability to broadcast our services over the internet and through social media. There have been some changes adopted such as wearing face masks, no singing or communion and a limited duration of the Worship Service. These changes have come about in an effort to help us stay healthy by following recommendations of the government and our Diocese. The Sanctuary is also disinfected after each service.

This has been and will still be a period of Stewardship in our church. Most of us are familiar with the "Three T's: Time, Talent and Treasure" that have been associated with our participation.

Our continued success has only been made possible by the Time and Talent of our Parishioners.

Happily, the Thrift Shop has re-opened as an unbelievable ministry to the general public. Members have performed an overall cleaning of the Church. The effort of many have and will continue in the evaluation of the

ever-changing process of reorganization to provide a safe Worship environment. The system that has been implemented to provide the ability to record and broadcast our services is amazing. The purchase of equipment and the constant tweaking to improve the process will allow for a permanent installation in the future.

These have been some major undertakings of our Parish, but possibly even more of an impact may be made through the small everyday examples that we perform naturally without even thinking, that proclaims the Love of God to others. A quick telephone call to check on our family members or possibly picking up a few items when we shop for others who may not feel comfortable in a store may have a significant impact. Even more may be just listening while someone expresses their concerns or fears. We are not always aware of needs or opportunities to volunteer our Time or Talent to St. Anne's, but a call to other Parish members or Mother Jennifer may provide just the right match for your service.

We are gratefully thankful for the continued financial support of our family members. We ask you to take a moment and prayerfully consider your level of future financial giving's. We understand that many of us are possibly facing financial challenges; St. Anne's is a place of peace and contentment. Please do not place undo concerns regarding financial commitments on your considerations, but listen to that Still, Small Voice.

Community Outreach

I cant Thank St Anne's enough for all you have done for the Community Panty. Donation, Volunteers to work at the Pantry, Volunteers who help pick up donations and St Anne's acting as a storage location (Ed is ever so grateful to get these out of our living room).

I wanted to give a couple of fun facts to show how much we can't do what we do with out your assistance.

- Each family of 4 receives approximately 30-35 meals per distribution (assortment of breakfast, lunch and dinner.
- 299 families received a Thanksgiving dinner in November (Turkey, vegetables, cranberry sauce, stuffing and a pie) on top of the 30-35 meals previously discussed
- Every family received sugar, flour plus other baking staples, as well as multiple boxed baking items (thanks to your donations)
- In October 5,543 bags of food was given out in October

Venmo: A mobile payment service

Venmo, a mobile payment service, is now an exciting option for St. Anne's in which account holders can transfer funds to others through a mobile app. Venmo is only available on mobile devices like a phone or tablet for both apple and android devices. It will seem like a lot of steps, but it is very user friendly and will guide you all the way.

If you are interested, go to the App store; search and select Venmo. It will be a Blue Square with a white V. You will then need to download the app.

Directions:

- Open Venmo app.
- Sign up enter your first name, last name, email address, & create a password
- Venmo will give you information on how it works scroll, read & then tap next
- Read the user agreement & privacy policy if you agree, tap next (upper right corner of the screen)
- Enter your phone number Venmo will send you a confirmation code
- A 4-digit confirmation code will be sent to your phone enter in the box & hit submit code
- In settings, (located in the 3 lines upper right corner); you can edit your profile & add a picture, so people know it is you (optional)
- In settings click payment method allowing you to add your debit card manually "add bank or card" – select card for your debit card information
- Search for St Anne's account "St Annes Episcopal Church North Billerica" (It does not have any punctuation in its name)
- When you send money, it will ask you "what is it for" please specify that this is a donation or for the Christmas fair & provide how you want to be contacted: (Phone or email)
- I will fill out your raffle tickets & confirm that it was received & your raffle tickets are ready

Venmo is one option; if you prefer, you may buy your tickets at the end of church service, thrift shop or scheduled on-site designated times

REPORT ON THE 235TH DIOCESAN CONVENTION

As one of the lay delegate representatives for St. Anne's to the 235th Diocesan convention that was held this year on November 7th I found the convention to be a totally different experience from other conventions. In other years we would drive into Boston or to another city in the Diocese to attend the convention at a church or hotel. This year I drove to St. Anne's where Kathy Brewster and I watched the convention on a laptop setup in the Nichols Room. Over 490 clergy members and delegates watched via ZOOM or You Tube. With a couple of minor technical glitches the convention went very smoothly as a virtual meeting.

Voting for the budget and resolutions was done on line with the tally available very quickly. The voting for various members to committees or commissions was done via an APP on delegates cell phones or someone actually called the delegate and after providing a PIN number you were able to cast your vote.

The Rt. Rev. Gates addressed the attendees stating how 2020 has been a year where "Brave Change has embraced us." A video tribute to the late Rt. Rev. Barbara C. Harris was presented. A wonderful video from the Barbara C. Harris Camp and Conference Center gave us a birds eye view of the lake, camp grounds, and trees with spectacular colors. Presentations were given by the Mission Strategy Committee, Diocese Youth Council, the office of Networking and Formation, the Racial Justice Commission, the Immigration and Multicultural Ministries, the Creation Care Justice Network, and the Young Adult Ministry. The \$9 million budget for 2021 was passed by the delegates. Three resolutions were adopted which Kathy and I will speak about in upcoming newsletters.



Accessing Mental Health Care in Eastern Mass

This very difficult year of disease, isolation, financial turmoil, and political strife has left most of us beaten-down and some of us overwhelmed and despondent. Multiple stressors, in different areas of life, are a recipe for feelings of depression, anxiety, and hopelessness. Unfortunately, such feelings make it more difficult to ask for help. The deep and pervasive stigma associated with mental health treatment only adds to the difficulty.

Thoughts that life is not worth living, that the people you love would be better off without you, or that you want to kill yourself are all indications of a psychiatric emergency; urgent treatment is needed. In Massachusetts we are fortunate to have a psychiatric emergency service that is available 24 hours a day / every day. This is an option in addition to calling 911 or going to a hospital emergency room. The Massachusetts Department of Mental Health website offers the following information and a statewide phone number:

If you or a family member are experiencing a mental health or substance use disorder crisis, the Emergency Services Program/Mobile Crisis Intervention (ESP/MCI) is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. Anyone may contact ESP/MCI for assistance. Call toll-free at 1 (877) 382-1609.

In MetroWest Boston, the area where most of us live, the group that offers psychiatric emergency services is Advocates, but there are other providers who provide this service for other geographic regions. A complete list, by region and town is available at:

If you want help, but not in an emergency, it is best to start with your primary care doctor or with a preferred provider list from your insurance company. It can take some time to get a non-emergent referral, but persistence is rewarded. There are therapies and medications available that can help.
