Dear Student,

This month, we will be learning about David. In your bible, please turn to the book of 1 Samuel (it is the ninth book in the bible). Please read Chapter 16, (verses 1 -13).

We meet several people in this chapter. There is Saul, the current King of the Israelites. There is Samuel, a prophet who listened to God. There is Jesse, the grandson of Ruth and a father of many sons. And there is David.

- Why was Samuel sad about Saul? What did God tell him?
- Why was Samuel afraid?
- What happened when Samuel saw the sons of Jesse? What did God say?
- I wonder how David felt being chosen?
- Have you ever been chosen for something?
- What happened when Samuel anointed David?
- How do you think David's older brothers felt?

David goes from being the youngest son and a shepherd to being anointed to be the next king. He doesn't become king right away. Saul was still king and could order people around.

Please read the rest of Chapter 16, verses 14-23.

- Why do you think the harp was able to help sooth Saul? (another word for a hand held harp is lyre)
- Have you ever been afraid? What do you do to feel safe and calm?

It can be hard to make choices. A game you can play with your family is called This or That? Everyone takes turns asking This or That questions. If it is just 2 people, you just take turns. For more people, sit in a circle and go around with the questions and answers. You can make up almost anything. Here are a few to get you started:

In the packet are some fun worksheets, a harp craft, and a God searches Hearts magnifying glass craft.


Next month, we will meet Solomon, David's son that becomes King after David dies.





### David Playing the Lyre

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- 1. Print the template onto cardstock. If you use regular paper glue the template onto a piece of construction paper for strength. (Template)
- 2. Cut out the template from the cardstock or construction paper.
- 3. Color in the template.
- 4. Using masking tape, tape five or six pieces of thin yarn onto the template.
- 5. Finally add glue and join both sides of the template together forming the harp.







#### Instructions

- 1. Print the templates. (Template)
- 2. Color and cut out the magnifying glasses.
- 3. Glue the magnifying glass pieces to cardstock for strength.
- 4. Cut out the magnifying glass from the cardstock.
- 5. Cut out the heart and circle template.
- 6. Glue the handles of the magnifying glasses together. Not the rim around the "glass."
- 7. Trace the heart onto a sheet of red construction paper and cut it out.
- 8. Trace the circle twice onto contact paper.
- 9. Cut out the circles.
- 10. Take the back off of one of the circles and in the center of the circle place the heart.
- 11. Remove the back of the other circle and place it on top of the heart/circle. This makes the "glass" of the magnifying glass.
- 12. Place the "glass" in between the rims of the magnifying glass templates, centering it.
- 13. Add glue to the templates to hold the "glass" in place.
