From the Wardens

Happy Spring!!

Baseball season is upon us, flowers and trees are blooming, grass is turning green and growing.... Everything is normal now, right?? Well, as my mother always says, "normal" is just a setting on the dryer.

What is normal is all the activity that goes on at St. Anne's. There are several updates I would like to tell you about:

- <u>Electrical Work:</u> In an earlier edition of our newsletter, I mentioned that we were trying to line up an electrician to permanently mount and wire our PTZ cameras so that we do not have cameras and cables strewn about the sanctuary. Additionally, some other electrical work around lighting and replacing the roof fans will be done. We have literally spoken to four electricians about this work, three have come out to visit with Mark and I to learn what work we need, and one has finally given us a quote for this work. The good news is that he will begin this work on May 12.
- <u>Vestry Retreat:</u> When the Vestry decided to hire a Priest-In-Charge (PIC), we knew that part of this arrangement would be to work with a PIC consultant from the diocese. The consultant will work with the Vestry and Mother Jennifer to work together. Our first step is a Vestry retreat with the consultant which happened on Saturday morning May 1. Of course, it was a virtual retreat on Zoom. Once we know more, we will be sure to keep you updated.
- Realm: No that is not a typo. Realm is a web based database that will streamline, among other things, our church directory. Look for this to be rolled out slowly over the next few months. There are many options and features that will be made available over time. But to begin with look for an email over the summer or early fall inviting you to set up your profile. There will be more information to come.
- <u>Virtual Services:</u> As I mentioned earlier, one of the barriers to re-opening, and the only one that we can control, is getting the technology that we have been use to bring you virtual services permanently mounted and wired.

We will continue to provide virtual services indefinitely. One of the "silver linings" to the Covid-19 pandemic is that we have discovered a way to bring worship to shut ins. On behalf of the steam team, we hope you have and continue to enjoy and found some comfort in worship services we have provided online.

As always, please stay healthy and safe. And get vaccinated as you are able and eligible. And GO SOX!!

A few words from the Re-Gathering Team

Re-gathering Team: Linda Kusnierz, Ken Kinser, Marguerite Massey, Kathy Brewster

The Re-Gathering Committee recently met to review the Bishops April 15 COVID-19 Guidelines. The Bishops expressed both hopefulness and the need to continue to be cautious. And stated, "Effective April 19 leaders in local congregations are invited to consider what level of in-person worship is now appropriate for their local context, while continuing to adhere to diocesan guidelines and capacity limits which are more restrictive than the current Commonwealth protocols."

In out last newsletter we shared concerns for regathering safely for in-person worship and what conditions needed to be in place to do so. One factor of concern was the mounting of the cameras, electrical and cable work needed. We are pleased that after many attempts there is a date for the work to be done in May. This is exciting in that it will eliminate obstructed views for in-person worshipers and ensure safety removing exposed wires and cables. Additionally, Billerica has been in a yellow status for 11 of the last 12 weeks (as of 4/23). Residents are steadily week over week receiving vaccinations which are now readily available.

The Re-Gathering group is happy to share we are hopeful that St. Anne's will soon be returning to Sunday in-person worship in June. Communications and details to follow from the Wardens and Mother Jennifer as well as your Re Gathering team.

For those wish to help with our wish list – we are looking for 300 sets. We are looking for a variety of sizes since families come in all shapes and sizes.







THE NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER: MAY 6, 2021

It is a day to ask the Divine's quidance for the future direction and protection of our multicultural nation.

Over the past month, I have spent a lot of time with parish records. If someone calls or emails the office wondering if we have documentation of their marriage, or their baptism, or their confirmation, I can check the files we have, hoping to find their name (some records are easier to locate than others!). Even if I am not successful--occasionally because the records are actually at a different church, more often because we are still updating and refining our filing systems--I find it fascinating to page through the history of this parish, catching glimpses of its story through the names, dates, and occasions carefully noted by past rectors.

I particularly love discovering family connections, realizing just how deeply woven St. Anne's parishioners have been with each other across time and generations. (This became wonderfully obvious when I began to sort through the columbarium records!) I imagine these networks as the root system of this parish, a nourishing underlayer that supports the congregation of today. Names and dates, from one perspective, are dry facts; from another, they are the bones from which human life rises. It is important to know them and remember them.

Beginning this month, we are going to publish parishioners' birthdays and anniversaries in the weekly bulletin as a way of honoring your ongoing lives. I will be maintaining this list and keeping it up to date. 

On March 23, 2021, the Massachusetts bishops jointly declared a climate emergency

(https://www.diomass.org/news/pray-learn-act-advocate-ma-bishops-declare-climate-emergency). Their statement included four action steps (pray, learn, act, advocate) as a way to focus our thinking and give us a way to begin responding. In order to be effective, the declaration needs to take concrete form, to change the way we understand our relationship to God's creation in light of such urgent need.

These four webinars are an opportunity to deepen our understanding of the four action steps, discussion, and interactive sharing. They are hosted by the Creation Care Justice Network (Diocese of Massachusetts), and by Rev. Dr. Margaret Bullitt-Jonas, the Missioner for Creation Care in the Episcopal Diocese of Western Massachusetts and the Southern New England Conference, United Church of Christ. She is also the creation care advisor for the Diocese of Massachusetts.

If you have felt powerless at the thought of climate change and its catastrophic effects on all life, this is a great way to begin to step into thoughtful action with the community of Christ. through the registration link is found on this website: https://www.diomass.org/creation-care.
