


You may never see the faces of the lives you have affected, but know you have made a difference. The House of Hope is there to help others and you are always there to lend support. Thank you.


We hope everyone had a good Christmas, and by the time you read this, it's probably 2022 already, so HAPPY NEW YEAR to everyone.

Re-Gathering Report

As a New Year of hopefulness and promise begins, the Re-Gathering Team continues to follow the guidance of the Diocese, the CDC, and the State as well as the requirements of the Town of Billerica. With winter upon us and a new variant spreading, it is important that we take care of ourselves and be mindful that in doing so, we are also taking care of others.

The Re-Gathering Team will meet on January 11th to discuss our current practices. The Diocese has not altered their recommendations, although they are also constantly evaluating the current conditions. During our meeting, we will discuss options for the Annual Meeting to be held either in-person or virtually. The Diocese has reminded us of the recommendations of the Commonwealth, which legally allow for Annual Meetings to be held remotely through April 1, 2022. We will make a recommendation regarding meeting virtually or in-person to the Rector, Wardens and Vestry.

An excerpt from a message sent from Ellen Harland, Lay Director of the Secretariat, to the Cursillo Community:

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The Secretariat has decided to postpone the March weekend indefinitely. The bishops have recently updated their guidelines regarding services and activities in the church during this pandemic, and those guidelines place limitations on physical distancing and the requirement of wearing masks indoors. The guidelines are obviously meant to protect the health of everyone. However, these guidelines would limit our normal manner in which a weekend is conducted.

The number of people being infected is still terribly high, in spite of many people being vaccinated. Thus, we cannot structure a weekend that would be meaningful and yet safe for our candidates and teams.

I hope it will not be too long before we can resume having weekends. In the meantime, we will continue to do our Ultreyas on Zoom on the third Saturday of every month. It is so important that we keep the spirit of Cursillo thriving during this time. I highly encourage you all to participate in the Ultreyas. Mark your calendar, call your sponsor, spread the word to people who haven't been to one recently. Christ is counting on us!

I pray that the Holy Spirit will continue to guide us in our ministries.




