




Movie Night

Jennifer's Journal July 2022

What is church?

The place where we cycle through every year with ritual celebrations around important events from birth to death, birthdays to anniversaries, doubts to hopes, God to his beloved people.

Some favorite quotes that make me think from professional development and continuing ed classes and conversations I've done lately:

There are other ways of doing things than what comes first to my mind.
