Dear Parish of St. Anne's.

I write to you on the morning of my departure for Israel/Palestine. I shall join about 25 others (including Pete Jeffrey) and our Bp Gayle Harris as she leads her 12th and last Pilgrimage. I shall bring my experience of a previous pilgrimage that I made in 1985 before I was ordained.

Outside my office at church, I posted a map of Israel with a listing of my daily itinerary.

In addition to visiting biblical places like Tekoa, Sepphoris, the Judean Desert, Jericho, Capernaum, Nazareth, Bethlehem, and Jerusalem, we will be hearing lectures and visiting museums of contemporary Israeli and Palestinian Christian daily life.

Especially, I look forward to meeting and worshiping with the Archbishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem and the Middle East at Jerusalem's St. George's Episcopal Cathedral. Bp Gayle assures my welcome as an ordained priest there, while at a Byzantine Orthodox church in Emmaus I am *not* invited to wear a collar (our symbol of the priesthood).

I hope my conversations with you about these experiences will last for months. How does place, both land and culture, contribute to the formation of a people and our expression of our faith? How has the land and culture of Billerica shaped us? What do we choose for our future? Think on these things with me, I pray.

I shall take each of your names with me as I pray in and walk the places where our forebears in faith lived and told their stories. My feet will get dusty, like our Lord's.


Thrift Shop Updates




Social Conscience Book Group

Jennifer's Journal

Christmas Services. Even after last month's article, I still have received no feedback about your thoughts and wishes! I take this to mean that the services offered will be satisfactory, although it is strange to think about Christmas services when autumn is only now completely here! We will have two services on Christmas Eve (probably at 1pm and ?). *No service on Christmas Day* which is a Sunday, 2022. No service on New Year's Eve Saturday. Regular 9:00am service on Sunday, New Year's Day.

Diocesan Convention. Pray for our parish delegates to Convention, Todd Baldwin and Michele O'Shea this year. Join me in expressing gratitude to them for seeking balance between their own views and those of the parish regarding the five resolutions coming before the Convention:

Setting up a fund for reparations whose dispersal will be decided in following years

Requiring an internship for cultural competency of ordinands

Paying Deacons the minimum necessary to enter the Church Pension Fund (\$25/mo)

General support and awareness of the Poor Peoples' Campaign

Foster right relationships between us Episcopalians and indigenous in our midst

The other part of Convention is the annual Address by our Diocesan Bishop Gates in which we hear his perspective about our Diocese and his hopes for our next year. It will include his response to *Suffragan Bishop Harris's upcoming retirement*. How will we have enough bishops to make visitations to all 180 congregations in our Diocese?

Welcome Flag. What does it mean to you? Out front, we currently have a flag in disrepair. It feels disrespectful; we wish to change it. To what shall we all choose to change it? If you see a flag you like, take a photo and send it to your wardens or members of our Social Justice Committee (Russell Bent, Brenda Komarinski, Marguerite Massey, and Michele O'Shea). Let us hear how you want the public to view us at St. Anne's.

Stewardship Sunday. Come to church November 13th and be a part of *the gratitude of St. Anne's to God* for another year of our life in community.

Our Parish Administrator. *Jayleigh Lewis will be leaving us*, very sadly. She has found a full-time church position close to her home beginning in mid-November. But she is very gracious in extending her service to us until we have her successor. Please talk with our Wardens and Treasurer about your suggestions.

Vestry Visitor. Our Church Insurance representative visited this month. I heard that we were assured by the thoughtful and generous coverage offered to Episcopal churches. An insurance manual is available in the Church Office. One item for us to consider is a *crisis management plan* for during a worship service.

From Vestry Resource Guide owned by every current vestry member now. On page 47 of the book we use for denominational guidance, the following questions are asked.

How is your congregation's understanding of its mission and vision represented in your budgeting process? What steps might you take to develop a budget that reflects these values?

Does your congregation have an accounting policies and procedures manual unique to your parish in addition to the *Manual of Business Methods in Church Affairs*? When was the last time it was reviewed and updated?

Are the financial statements of related non-worshiping entities (such as thrift shops, ECW, men's groups, preschools) reviewed by the vestry and included in year-end reporting, including the annual audit and parochial report filing?

In what ways are your church buildings serving your congregation's mission and hopeful vision for the future? How might they serve them better?

Are inventories (lists or video) of furnishings and equipment for insurance purposes current and complete?

I was astonished to read this list of questions, because every one of these items has been addressed by St. Anne's. I think the recent work you all have done to update the best practices for ministry at St. Anne's has been and continues to be extraordinary. It's incredible! Thank you, each of you.



From the Wardens

We've now had our first Sunday with 2 services, one at 8 am and one at 10 am. We'll continue with one Sunday a month dedicated to 2 services and continue to monitor attendance and encourage parishioners to continue to provide us with feedback.

November is traditionally Stewardship month and we've designated Sunday November 13 as Stewardship Sunday. Everyone will be getting a stewardship letter and pledge cards in the next few weeks, so start thinking about pledging. The pledge is important because it allows us to prepare a budget and accurately plan our finances for the following year. If you do pledge, please consider sending your pledge in early and if you don't currently pledge, please consider doing so.

A few things are on-going with B&G:

The new columbarium is up and standing, but requires a few more screws to make it secure.

The Thrift Shop is DRY – no more water running through the kitchen every time it rains. By the time you read this update, the mold will be removed, and surfaces treated to mitigate the possibility of future problems.

Temperature control for the church will be considerably improved once we get the furnace people in to help set up the controls.

A replacement railing is in process for the one that was damaged by a car.

A plan is being developed to re-construct the Thrift Shop kitchen area. Work to be done after the first of the year.

And that's the short list. The real list of everything to be done would take up the whole newsletter.

Every year, we need to elect new vestry persons to take the place of those whose terms are up. A normal term is 3 years, and the terms are offset so that the term for 1/3 of the vestry is replaced every year. The job of the nominating committee is to come up with names of people that might be interested in serving on the vestry. If you're interested or know someone who is, please let us know.

That's it for the wardens this month.

Regathering Report

The Regathering Team met in late September to review areas related to the COVID response.

In August, the Diocese released Fall 2022 COVID-19 Guidelines,

https://www.diomass.org/news/diocesan-news/fall-2022-covid-19-guidelines

In summary, the guidelines referred to **physical distancing**, **mask wearing** in line with guidance from the Massachusetts Department of Public Health, continue to promote **good ventilation**, no restrictions on the **distribution of Holy Communion** referring to the March 28 communication, intinction continues to be discouraged. **Care of the most vulnerable**, highly recommend full COVID vaccination, including boosters by all persons engaged in this ministry. Mask wearing is required for in home **pastoral visits**. Be aware of **COVID transmission** in your area.

Mask wearing is optional at St. Anne's. It is important that we all monitor our health, adjust our activities, and recognize those who are most vulnerable in our comings and goings. Masks will be worn by those who are distributing the Holy Communion.

Disinfecting misting is no longer being performed following services as determined by the current transmission in our area. We have learned since the early days of the pandemic that it is not necessary.

We are pleased to have more activity and event planning has begun at St. Anne's. We reviewed guidelines related to food handling. Food servers are recommended to wear gloves and food is to be individually wrapped.

While COVID continues to be around us, and the flu season has begun, we encourage everyone to receive flu vaccines and booster vaccines for COVID.




