Thrift Shop Updates

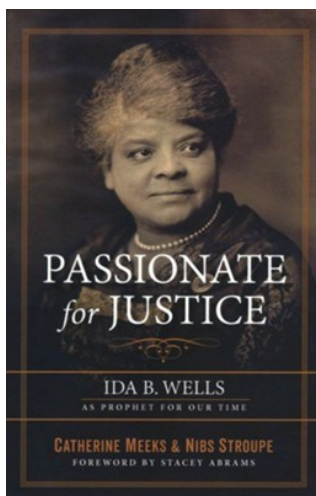

Starting at 3pm, in the First Parish Church's community room, will be drumming and dancing presented by GLICA.



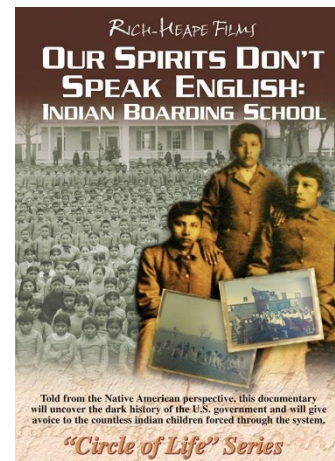

Town & Diocesan Indigenous Peoples' Day Events October 8 & 10

Israel itinerary and request

From Palestinian Nazareth, day trips to Sea of Galilee, Capernaum, Jordan River, Mount of Beatitudes. Also north to Caesarea Philippi and Sepphoris. Then south to Jerusalem by way of Samaria and current towns of Burquin, Nablus, and Taybeh. From Jerusalem, we will walk to many holy sites familiar to all readers of the Bible. We will pass into the West Bank in order to visit Bethlehem. We will hear evening lectures about Islam, and contemporary issues in Israeli life. We will meet with the Archbishop of the Episcopal Church in Jerusalem and the Middle East. And there will be many more sights visited.

I would love to hear your wonderings about the Holy Land. What can Pete Jeffrey and I bring back to you? (Yes! He is also a pilgrim on this trip being led by our Bishop Gayle Harris!)

Diocesan Convention October 28 & 29

“By this they will know you: The Call of Love in Our Time and Place”

Not only are these words full of meaning, but the logo design adds further dimensions.

The 5 Resolutions this year address

- Establishing a Reparations Fund

- Parishes paying deacons \$25 per month to give them access to Church Pension Fund services

- Supporting the Poor Peoples' Campaign

- Equipping ordained leaders through establishing a seminarian's practicum in a different cultural context

- Fostering right relationships with indigenous neighbors.

The subject matter of our Resolutions, this year, is unusually focused on relationships with each other, as our Diocesan Mission Strategy calls on us to be.

We had two parishioners who gave me written feedback about the Resolutions and here are their words: “It can be noted that the financial impact of reparations always turns out to be small in comparison to suffering, cruelty, murder and suppression of people that has happened throughout history, and continues today.”

“Reparation is still a tough topic. I can see how St. Anne's was created by the mill owners who used cotton from the South, but does St. Anne's in Lowell or North Billerica have funds to donate to this fund when we are only able to afford part time clergy? (Mthr Jennifer replies: This Resolution asks nothing of 95% of our parishes, including ours.)

The biggest changes have to come from our hearts and our attitudes that we learned. As someone said, the government and financial institutions played a large part in the social injustices that took place in our country over many years. We need to continue to share, talk, and educate everyone so the next generation does a better job. The words and ideals in the Bible need to be brought to the forefront of our actions now and for future generations.”

Thank you, dear parishioners, for thinking about the work our Convention of Delegates will take up this fall.



Christmas Day Services?

With December 25th on Sunday in 2022, the Wardens and I ask your opinions about having no church service that day, since we will have had two services on Christmas Eve.

As the same calendar problem occurs the following week on New Year's Day, we thought we **will** have one service at 9:00am.

This situation last happened in 2017 (when we did have services that were usually attended) and will not again until 2034! **What do you think?**

St. Anne's Columbarium

The columbarium at St. Anne's is a sacred final resting place where parishioners may inter the remains of their loved ones and is treated with the same respect as a mausoleum. The columbarium is attached to a wall within the Memorial Garden. Each niche is a single compartment within the columbarium designed to hold one person's cremated remains.

Helpful information for you to know:

Use of the columbarium is available to communicants of St. Anne's & their families; to former members who have relocated out of the diocese; and others with familial connections to the parish.

Church members/participants can reserve niches.

The contract form is available from the priest or the church office.

A pre-need purchase of a niche may be made over time.

The current fee is \$700 for a permanent, single niche. The fee includes:

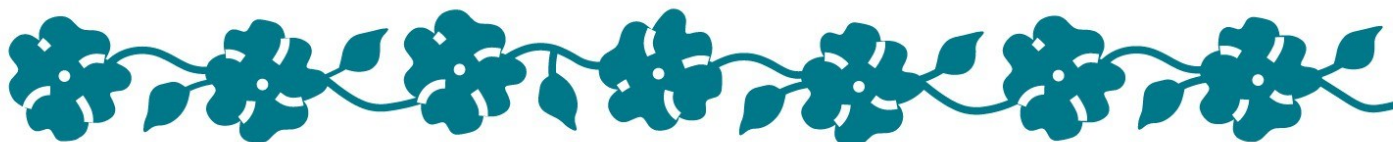
- Opening & sealing at the time of interment

- A brass plaque with the person's name, years of birth & death, will be mounted on the cover of the niche

- One family member will be given a key to access the Memorial Garden

- Perpetual care of the columbarium and garden area will be maintained by the Gardening Angels.

The full policy is located on the bulletin board in the corridor of the Parish Hall.



Billerica is a community that cares for its residents the same as we care for each other at St. Anne's.

Giving back if you are able - The Billerica Community Pantry is reaching out to our Faith organizations in town to hold a food drive to supply our clients with the fixings to make plentiful holiday meals. We are asking all faith communities to give a little; St. Anne's has been asked to provide the majority of two items – Cranberry Sauce and Stuffing Mix. Do you feel up to the challenge of collecting almost 300 of each? Please start bringing your items to church from now until the end of October to be given out at our November distributions. If you don't have time to go shopping please let me know I have shopping elves ready and waiting to spend your money.

St. Anne's also provides "Elves" that faithfully check the donation bins at both Market Baskets in town and bring the generous offerings to the Pantry 4-5 times a week. I do hope they know how much they are appreciated and vital to the Pantry.

The Billerica Holiday Festival is back! Participation Applications are going to be sent out soon and due to restrictions at the Billerica Library we will only be allowed to have 27 Trees at the library this year; they will be assigned based on when the application is returned.

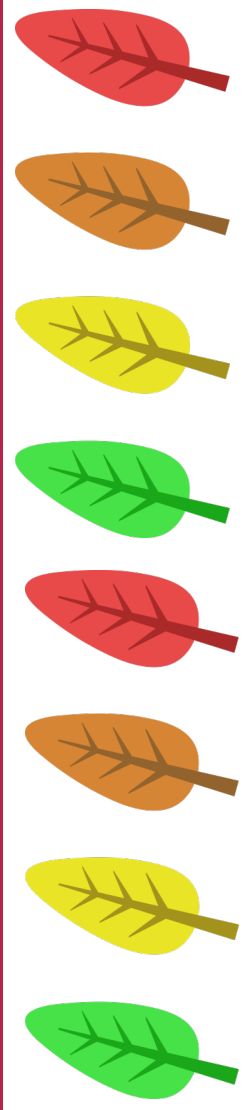
