I thank each one of you for your participation in our life together. Even if "all you do" is to pray for St. Anne's, that is a mighty work, and it is needed says our Lord of Life.



Brian A. Wren is an internationally published hymn-poet and writer. Wren's hymns appear in hymnals of all Christian traditions around the world and have been influential in raising the awareness of theology in hymns. Brian Wren is married to Rev. Susan M. Heafield, a United Methodist pastor.

Being born in 1936, he was one of the first prolific writers of new hymn texts after the liturgical renewals of the middle third of the 20th century



### Warden's Message

It's Lent and it's getting a bit warmer and by the time you get this, it will officially be Spring. Hopefully no more snowstorms and no more water issues!

Many of you know we received a sizable bequest from Al and Margaret Westerlund's estate last year. In order to ensure that these funds be used properly, we've put together the Bequest Committee whose function is to determine how these funds can best serve the needs of St. Anne's and honor Al and Margaret.

The Committee met in early March to start the process by first establishing major categories where the funds might be used – the Church building, Thrift Shop, Bixby Hall, Admin areas, Nichols Room, Parking Lot, Investment and Outreach. Under these categories we listed specific needs and desires, short term and long term. We're not intending to use any of the Bequest funds for operating expenses or in place normal Buildings and Grounds (B&G) issues such as a leaking faucet, maintenance of the fire alarm system or finishing up some work in the Thrift shop after getting the water issues under control. We *will* be looking at larger problems such as siding and roof repair on the Church building, making an entrance that meets the requirements for handicap access, and improving heat and A/C for the Thrift Shop. Our next task is to start putting approximate dollar requirement next to many possible needs and start prioritizing.

If you have something in mind, don't hesitate to let us know and we'll add it to the list either for the Bequest funds or B&G.

### Social Justice Committee





### Simnel Cake Recipe

Simnel Cake Recipes have evolved over the centuries from a simple recipe using ingredients often 'given up' during Lent (butter, sugar, dried fruits) to very complex recipes that add a variety of fruits (some soaked in brandy), marzipans, spices & decorative icings. What was once a gift from a daughter in training to serve the needs of a wealthy household who was allowed to visit her own family on Mothering Sunday (4<sup>th</sup> Lent) has now become an intricate festive concoction that is rich family treat. The simple recipe that follows was taken from the Albany, NY, <u>Cathedral News</u> in 1985. It was used to make the cookies & cupcakes for St. Anne's coffee hour on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Lent. Any changes made to the original, simple recipe are included in [brackets]. To find many varied, complex recipes, just look online.

½ cup softened butter or margarine 1 cup flour [self-rising] ½ cup sugar [brown sugar] 2 ounces candied citron peel 1½ cups currants [= 6oz baq] 2 eggs [1 teaspoon pumpkin pie spice]

Mix the ingredients together & bake in a greased loaf pan for approximately one hour at 300 degrees. [For cookies, I used a 1/8 cup scoop (for small meatballs) 2" apart on a parchment paper lined baking sheet or in a cupcake paper. Bake at 350 degrees for 8 to 10 minutes (12 for the cupcakes).
